Birth Father's views

Wherever possible, and if the agency considers it appropriate, this record should be completed by the birth father, in his own words. It may be used as an important source of information for the agency in making its decisions and, when and where appropriate, for the child and the adoptive parents/permanent carers in understanding the child's background.

It is important that the birth mother and father understand the importance of these questions and the reasons why they are being asked. The forms should be used wherever possible within the context of a counselling interview(s). These forms could be revisited and updated at later points in the permanence planning process, if the birth parents have been helped to make further contributions or changed their views.

The information gathered from the birth father's and birth mother's forms should then be included in the main report and a copy of the forms placed on the child's adoption/permanence file.
