## Meeting of the Community Council for the Royal Burgh of Forres held in the Tolbooth, Forres, on Thursday 15 th October 2015

2.	Police Scotland Update: PC Jad Leach delivered the report. Motoring: Female,46, charged with dangerous driving and driving under the influence of drink or drugs. Four days later the same female was kept for court after being charged with driving under the influence of drink or drugs. She was released on bail and awaits trial. Male,46,charged with driving without a licence. Drug offences: two males,16,charged with possession of Cannabis; Male,35,charged with possession of Cannabis; Male,35,charged with possession of Cannabis. Other offences: Male,22,charged and put to court for smashing window of Police vehicle whilst it was parked unattended. He was later released on curfew bail.Male,37,charged with playing excessively loud music and failing to desist when warned. Several items of stereo equipment have been seized. Female,44,charged with assault of male,21,on Forres High Street.  Feedback from previous FCC meeting: Attention has been given to areas of Anderson Drive and MacDonald Drive following reports of excessive speed. There were few instances when Police were in the area. The issue of hazardous parking outside fast food outlets on High Street has been highlighted to officers and tickets have been issued. The initial approach is to educate drivers. Responding to a query PC Leach said that it is permissible to park on a single yellow line outside the designated time scale. The increased difficulties during the period when new paving is being laid were highlighted. E. Hayward suggested that owners of the Fast Food outlets be asked to display notices about dangerous parking. 3.	additional patrols during the October break.  Public Session: MOTP asked for an update on Castlehill Church. She is	
	concerned what will happen when winter is past. The owner has not made any improvements and three dates for action have been passed. It was reported that Cllr Alexander said that progress is being made and he has not given up on pursuing the issue. E. Hayward reported that she has contacted Craig Wilson and Historic Scotland. She has received papers about demolition of listed buildings. It is a lengthy and complex process.

	stated that the Treatment Works does not have the capacity for	
	additional housing. It is now stated that there is adequate capacity.	EH

6.	Clir Skene: Heldon and Laich Election: The election of an Independent	
	candidate means that the present administration will continue. <b>Teacher</b>	
	<b>Summit:</b> Representatives of 7 North East local authorities attended a	
	summit with the Cabinet Secretary for Education. The present difficulties in	
	recruiting staff were made very clear. TMC has met staffing requirements for	
	this year's census and will not be charged for shortage. Children and	
	Young People: Proposals are being formulated for re-zoning of Secondary	
	Schools and consultation opportunities will be provided. It is proposed that	
	all pupils living in the Alves Catchment Area will transfer to Forres Academy.	
	Forres Station Upgrade: The public information session was well attended.	
	50 parking spaces are to be provided at the new station. Cllr Skene thinks	
	that more spaces will be needed when a more regular service between Elgin	
	and Inverness is begun. <b>Kinloss Church</b> will be celebrating its 250 <sup>th</sup>

	Anniversary with an Open Day on Saturday 17 <sup>th</sup> October.  CIIr McLean: TMC has identified derelict buildings in Moray and is contacting owners, where possible, to assess future plans which may include compulsory purchase and demolition. There are 4 properties in Forres to be assessed. Moravia Museum will have an Opening Ceremony on Saturday 12 <sup>th</sup> October. A96 Dualling: Rafford residents are unhappy with one of the options for the new road. They will be contacting Community Councils to seek support. Network Rail will issue a leaflet about the improvements to be made to all houses from Inverness to Aberdeen.  CIIr Creswell: Integrated Health and Social Care is progressing with partnerships growing. There will be consultation meetings in November to consider priorities. CIIr Creswell is keen to get a local meeting group to look at wellbeing. Clean Up Projects: Any group requiring equipment for litter picks etc should contact Fiona Burnett who will advise and give support.  Network Rail: The team listened to local views and will adapt the plans where appropriate. Living Golf: CIIr Creswell attended sessions in Forres and Lossiemouth to see the support and tuition given to those with a health challenge.  Tsi Moray Awards: Forres was well represented at the ceremony and volunteers recognised for the contributions they make to the Forres area.

12.	Any other Competent Business:	
	a) Macbeth Costumes Displays: E. Hayward encouraged the public to	
	visit the displays from the recent Macbeth film which may be seen at	
	the Falconer Museum, Brodie Castle, Elgin Museum and Johnsons	
	Mill, Elgin.	
	b) Forres High Street: E. Hayward suggested that there be a 20 mph	
	speed limit for Forres High Street. It was felt that through the day	
	traffic is slow moving but it would restrict speed at night. Other	
	communities have this restriction. In Nairn High Street traffic calming	
	measures have been installed. G. Murdoch suggested that to	
	discourage HGVs travelling along High Street a sign should be	EH
	installed at the foot of Bridge Street reading: No HGVs except for	
	deliveries. Cllr Skene suggested that a sign at the foot of Market	
	Street directing HGVs travelling to the west to go around the	
	roundabout and head towards Elgin may help the traffic flow and	
	reduce congestion. S. Ferris asked E. Hayward to write to Kevin	
	Price to enquire about regulations for speed limits, traffic calming and	
	and signage.	
	FCC has done nothing about the <b>raised kerb at Cumming Street</b>	CII
	which has caused several accidents. E.Hayward said that TMC has	Clir
	responded to say that the kerb is at this height to prevent lorries from	Skene
	mounting the pavement. Cllr Skene offered to take this forward.	
	d) MOTP reported that there is a cobbled area behind the Co-op next	
	to the disabled parking spaces which is dangerous for those alighting	
	from vehicles. S. Ferris asked if it is TMC or Co-op responsibility. E.	EH
	Hayward will contact Kevin Price.	
	e) Overhanging branches: G. Murdoch reported that several	
	properties in Forres have overhanging branches which are restricting	
	access. The hedge at Transition Town Forres (TTF) and Christie's	
	Elite Nursery is growing further and further in to the roadway. S.	
	Ferris told the meeting that TTF pays TMC to cut hedge.
