2.	Police Scotland Update: J. Guthrie read the report. Anti Social -	
	Behaviour: Two 12 year old boys were threatened with a knife by a 17 year	
	old male who was charged and out to court where he was granted bail.	
	Male,16, charged with using threatening and abusive language on High	
	Street. He was reported to the Youth Justice Management Unit. Male,21,	
	given a Fixed Penalty Notice for shouting, swearing and behaving in a	
	disorderly manner on High Street. Male, 25, given a Fixed Penalty Notice for	
	conducting himself in a disorderly manner in licensed premises.	
	Male,16,charged with using threatening and abusive behaviour towards	
	Police and resisting arrest. A report has been submitted to the Youth Justice	
	Management Unit. Theft: Male, 26, put to court and remanded in custody	
	following theft of prescription medication and housebreaking. Male,16,	
	charged with theft by shoplifting at a local supermarket. He was found to be	
	in possession of a personal quantity on cannabis. A report will be sent to the	
	Youth Justice Unit. Local Priorities: The division will be carrying out high	
	visibility as well as pro-active patrols in hotspot areas tackling violent	
	disorder and anti – social behaviour. To date a low number of incidents have	
	been reported.	
	Beat Doorstep Crime Initiative: Leaflet drops and posters are being	
	displayed offering advice. It is important that awareness is there and any	
	such activity reported to Police.

4.	Ratification of Minutes of 19 th November 2015	
	The Minutes were proposed by E. Hayward, seconded by C. Rodger and	
	ratified by the Chair, S. Noble.	
5.	Matters Arising:	
	Playpark Equipment: E. Hayward reported that work will commence	

	as soon as possible. She had received requests from residents about	
	provision in other play areas. S. Noble suggested that the 20/20	
	Planning for Real exercise will provide an opportunity for ideas to be	
	brought forward.	
	Lochyhill Water Issues: E. Hayward has not had a response from	
	Joanna Peebles. She will contact a more senior member of staff if	EH
	there is still no response. G. Murdoch reported the concerns of	
	landowners about the overflow from the SUDS pond which may flood	
	in to the ditch. It is queried why the water is not fed in to the	
	Forbeshill double system. Recently a spate had broken through the	
	bank at Anton's Pool. E. Hayward asked if Moray Cllrs could raise	
	the issue. Cllr Alexander replied that he has been given an	
	assurance that there will not be a problem. G. Murdoch asked what	
	will happen if there is a problem in years ahead when the contractor	
	is no longer responsible for the site and landowners may incur costs.	
	Cobbles behind Co-op Disabled Parking: Some of the cobbles	
	have been removed by TMC and further work has to be done.	
	Traffic Issues: E. Hayward reported that the proposals about HGV	
	traffic will not be possible. Drivers are still going down the wrong way	
	in Caroline Street. There has been no progress with setting up a	
	traffic survey in Fleurs.	
6.	Moray Councillors' Reports:	
0.	Clir Alexander has had a meeting with Police Scotland Inspector	
	McCruden. A present focus is on complaints about poor driving and a	
	yellow car in particular. An appointment has been made for the post of Head	
	of Schools and Curriculum Developmement. Syrian Refugees: Forres	
	has been designated as the Moray location for four families from Syria. The	
	families have been in camps in Syria and proper procedures have been undertaken for their move to the UK. S. Noble asked what FCC can do to	
	help. Clir Alexander said that the Refugee Council and TMC are co-	
	ordinating support from the appropriate agencies. It is suggested that time is	
	needed to allow the families to settle. Tolbooth Flagpole : The pole has been taken down meantime. The wires had become stretched and it will be	
	replaced as soon as possible. CIIr Creswell: Community Planning Issues: The meeting in Forres had	
	been well attended. Health and Social Care : The plans are now available	
	for consultation. The next stage will be to form Locality Groups. Cllr Creswell	
	has attended meetings of The Health Alliance; Drug and Alcohol	
	Forum; The Disability Forum; Forres Golf Course; Domestic Violence	
	and the Rafford A96 pressure group. A public meeting is to be held	
	about the shooting of geese at Findhorn Bay. Although some residents are	
	calling for a ban there is no legislation to enable this at present. A petition	
	may be sent to TMC. TMC budget: The position for 2016 is worse than	
	expected and will become clearer following the council meeting next week.	
	Forres Area Forum is organising a meeting of local groups to share	
	information about roles and responsibilities with a view to avoid duplication
