Welcome to the winter edition of the Moray Shared Lives Newsletter. We are at the end of the year already and it is a time for reflection and looking to the New Year ahead.

Looking back on the past year for our service, we have seen new staff join the office team, the carer team has grown at a pace and a plan is in place for yet more staff to join the team to support the service growth. We have had a recruitment ban in place over the last 3 months, to allow time for all the new carers to settle in to the team and we are now contacting our waiting list of potential new carers who may join our service over 2017. As you may already know, we were also awarded the highest grade – 6 (excellent) from the Care Inspectorate this year too. This is a wonderful accolade for everyone involved with the service, for all the hard work and amazing results achieved.

95 people now attend our day support provision with Moray Shared Lives – providing over 700 hours of care each week. We have 40 current carers across Moray and 3 of them provide a small amount of overnight respite each month too. In the New Year, we will start to provide long term placements within our Moray Service. We have 4 people ear marked to provide the service in the first half of 2017, when suitable placements are identified. This will involve matched people going along to stay with a Shared Lives Family. We have continued support from commissioners to grow the office team in line with the carer team over 2017 and we have a full time clerical assistant, to be based in the office, from the 9th of January. It is certainly an exciting time to be part of the growing Shared Lives Service locally.

Sharing new ideas.....

Peer support within our growing carer team, is increasing all the time and they often meet up to go along to clubs, local cafes etc together. Our carers have thought of some innovative ways to support the people that use the service to meet their full potential, over the last few months. Some have banded together to form our new Shared Lives Craft Group, some meet each week at local public houses to play pool, maintain social contact and community involvement and others have accessed established groups locally e.g. Monday Club, singing groups, Alzheimer Scotland Events, to name only a few!
