

Moray SEBN Service

The Moray SEBN Service is a Moray wide service which offers targeted support to children and young people to help address their social, emotional and behavioural needs (SEBN).

Primary and secondary pupils are referred to us by their school; prior to approaching our Service school staff will have followed and evidenced the staged intervention process involving a range of inschool, community and multi-agency supports; we build on this foundation.

Our key aims are stated below:

- To promote the health and wellbeing of children and young people who display social, emotional and behavioural needs (SEBN)
- To support participation and opportunity to access mainstream education for young people who are displaying SEBN
- To work in partnership with schools, families, young people and appropriate agencies to ensure a high quality of education appropriate to the needs of the child
- To offer support, advice and training opportunities to school staff

Who are the Moray SEBN?

Moray SEBN are a small team made up of primary and secondary teachers, pupil support assistants, project workers, a pupil counsellor and a school nurse.

We work with a range of agencies to help a child or young person to overcome the barriers or issues they may have with school work, friendships or at home.

Although beginning work with the Moray SEBN Service can be daunting for young people, we know that they grow to like and trust staff when they realise that we are consistently working together for their best interests.

What Do We Offer?

We work in partnership to provide a personalised alternative curriculum focussing on health and wellbeing, the key features of which are detailed below:

- Key teacher and key worker system for guidance, personal and social development and the holistic care and welfare of pupils.
- Appropriate procedures for accessing wellbeing needs from which personal pupil health and wellbeing targets are set.
- Multi-agency partnership work.
- Opportunities to complete accredited wider achievement skills awards which may encompass literacy and numeracy outcomes.
- Post-16 planning to facilitate successful participation in life and work.

Supports Offered by the Moray SEBN Service

Health & Wellbeing Groups

Based on nurture principles these are designed to support young people to address challenges they face in becoming self-aware and self-regulating and to develop the skills required to fully participate in life, learning and work. Held at both Campuses their content is personalised to the young people attending, informed by the Boxall Profile and accredited through wider achievement awards.

Observe and Advise

Moray SEBN Service staff will observe pupils in the classroom environment and offer strategies designed to target specific behaviours.

Outdoor Education

This is offered as an early intervention strategy for small groups of pupils whom schools identify would benefit from input to develop social interactions with peer groups. It also builds resilience, self-esteem and develops team work skills.

Support in Schools

Moray SEBN Service staff work with pupils in school or a community setting to model and support appropriate behaviours. This can be done 1:1, in small groups, or with whole class groups.

Personalised Support

Moray SEBN Service staff provide 1:1 support on social, emotional and behavioural issues at both the Beechbrae and Pinefield Campuses.

Training

Moray SEBN Service staff may provide training in Circle Time, WOWW, Zones of Regulation, PBS, Solution Oriented and Restorative approaches.
