Thinking of training to teach?

Moray Council supports various PGDE programmes by providing school experience placements to students and mentoring by school staff. For some courses a probationary year in Moray can be guaranteed. On successful completion of their probationary year, all probationers are welcome to and encouraged to apply for teaching vacancies in Moray.

PGDE - Post Graduate Diploma in Education -

One year programme for those already holding a degree.

PGDE - Distance Learning Initial Teacher Education programme (DLITE)

18 month distance learning programme for those already holding a degree.

- Partnership delivery of a PGDE programme provided by Aberdeen University and Moray Council.
- Programme delivered online through distance learning by Aberdeen University apart from 8 face-to-face network days which will be on Saturdays and may be in collaboration with Highland colleagues and participants. 18 weeks of full time school placements will be in Moray as will probationer year.
- Entry requirements Graduate with relevant working or voluntary experience of working with young people specifically in a primary classroom setting; Higher English at Grade C or above – or equivalent; mathematics National 5 at Grade C or above; Standard Grade at Grade 2 or above; Intermediate 2 at Grade C or above – or equivalent.
- Competent ICT skills appropriate for engaging in online distance learning.
- Must be living within the relevant partnership local authority.
- This programme is suitable for people currently in employment. Participants need to negotiate time off their work to engage in compulsory teaching practice blocks and the 8 compulsory Saturday network days.

Return to teaching

- Courses recognised by the GTCS are offered by the University of Edinburgh with the City of Edinburgh Council and in Glasgow by the University of Strathclyde.
