1.	<b>Welcome and apologies</b> : The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting and apologies were recorded.	
2.	Community Safety Report: No CSR available. No police in attendance.	
3	Ratification of Minutes 17 <sup>th</sup> December 2020: The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed and accepted as a true record.  Proposed: David Parker Seconded: Fiona Graham	
4.	Matters arising/updates: GM confirmed that the funding for the development officer and admin support for Leanchoil Trust came from Earnhill Trust. Roy Dennis unable to make the meeting so will reschedule this for later in the year. AT to rearrange.  SSEN Funding. Discussion took place on whether FCC content to support individuals, level of awards and ensuring compliance with GDPR. It was felt that decision made at last meeting that awards would be made to individuals in need rather than organisations supporting Covid as they were already receiving funding from other sources. JL to check with Quarriers and Jane Martin on GDPR procedures  Vote on setting amount to £100 – agreed  Vote to agree 2 further donations of £100 to families identified – agreed  It was agreed SM would arrange with MFCU to allocate £300 for distribution  JL to email FACT to progress  Cllr Creswell raised issue of difficulty of sharing information to help people. 5.	Chair's report	
6.	Email complaint from Mr Taylor, Rafford. In outline he's unhappy that FCC retains 2 associate members associated with the A96 dualling and this is still on agenda. The email also states the minutes are not detailed enough. Discussion took place on the matter. Chair stated that FCC look after community of Forres which doesn't cover Rafford. and under FCC rules section 9. Additional Membership: associate members can be appointed by FCC where individuals have a particular skill or knowledge that may be needed. GM and SM had met with associate members for an update regarding where Transport Scotland are with A96 dualling and whether it would be worth FCC writing to them so FCC still in picture. Biggest concerns raised with FCC is impact on town of traffic linking to A96, but no letters have been written to Transport Scotland. FCC committee agreed to keep on agenda and retain associate membership until A96 dualling progresses further. SM to draft response to Mr Taylor.  Treasurer's report £2406.42 including deduction of £200 pounds for grant.	SM
7.	Secretary's report	
8.	Health Centre Forms from Fiona. There had been a problem with downloading forms from Health Centre website, but this seemed to be working now.  Energising Moray Group (EMG). SF raised concerns about letter from EMG that appeared to suggest that group would take all money from windfarm community funds and distribute throughout Moray for green initiatives. Discussion took place on this. SM had attended and thought it related to Clash Gour and not all windfarms, but letter referred directly to Berry Burn. Current Berry Burn fund will continue as at present. Berry Burn 2 will be administered differently. Cllr Feaver stated that people are concerned about remit of EMG and JCC and how these fit together. She has concerns about EMG and there needs to be clarification on difference between community benefit and investment. Need to understand community ownership of turbines. 2 types of community benefit – buying in to turbines and community benefit. Query about governance of JCC and CC's. Who is responsible to whom? SM confirmed FCC not held to account by JCC – JCC brings CC's. Any concerns raised to Cllr Feaver will be directed to SM for action.  SM to raise at next JCC as letter signed off by Chair of JCC. 	SM - Osprey bus – not much happening at moment. Skate Park – applied to Berry Burn and Awards for All for funding. Alan James Associates appointed to prepare a business plan for skate park.  GM – KS advised that waiting for date for drop kerbs to be installed. Green Spaces - email from Sylvia (MC) to get meetings up and running - GM attends green spaces meetings. Mosset Burn survey - will get back to Bob to move forward.  SF - question about provision of schooling in Forres and if this is something to raise with MC Education Department. Are families happy with education their children are getting? Concern also about Moray's position of 31 out of 32 in Scotland for achievement. Discussion took place on home-schooling and provision of resources and teaching. Is this a remit of CC's – if there is a problem then should we be raising with MC? Elected members commented that all are aware of situation. There appears to be variance across year groups and schools. Survey being carried out of all parents on their experience of home-schooling and how they and children are coping. Cllr Feaver has written to Director of Education on issues raised with her and is awaiting a response. All acknowledged that teaching staff are working extremely hard, that some teachers are parents so having to school own children and system is not perfect but lot of work going on to keep improving situation. Complaints taken to FCC should be passed to elected member to take to MC Officers for action.	GM
