# The City & Royal Burgh of Elgin Community Council

#### 1. Welcome and Apologies

#### 2. Previous Minutes:

The minutes of the January 2021 meeting were proposed by Sheila Cochrane and seconded by Eddie Wallace. There were no objections and the minutes were accepted as a true record of the meeting.

#### 3. Matters Arising

- a. Stagecoach: There was no representative from Stagecoach present
- b. Dr Gray's (Update): An update from Jamie Hogg was read out and discussed. It was noted that eye care has waiting times of over a year. Maternity service beds are being reduced in number until the unit is refurbished. Diabetes clinic are progressing by phone.

Douglas Clark to write to the NHS regarding clinic delays.

#### 4. Common Good Fund - Consultation:

It was noted that the common good database, such as it is, is being digitised.

The sale of a piece of ground near the biblical garden was reviewed and thought to be reasonable given its location.

Alastair Kennedy to write to the Moray Council advising them of the Community Council's opinion.

### 5. The Oaks (Covid vaccines help):

There was a discussion on what we could do to help in defeating Covid which started from a request from The Oaks. Anyone wishing to volunteer to help. It was agreed to use the remaining £300 from the covid funds to go to Foodbank helping people affected by the current circumstances.

#### Litter

There was a discussion on litter in Elgin noting areas of concern as Bishopmill, Beechbrae, Spynie Street, Morriston Road, Edgar Road. The work of the Positive Action Group was very much appreciated.

Alsatair Kennedy to post an appropriate comment from Elgin Community Council on the Positive Action facebook page.

The reasons for litter at takeaways and flytipping were discussed (No where to put it; Don't count as litter; Perception of space). The flood alleviation area was also noted. This had been moved previously.

#### 7. Asbestos Surveys

It was noted that asbestos surveys going on in rented accommodation during covid were discussed. It was highlighted that these are not essential activities in the current circumstances.

An objection has been submitted against the planning application for a proposed general industry (Class 5) and storage/distribution (Class 6) building at Elgin Trade Park Ashgrove Road Elgin Moray IV30 1AZ. Details were circulated.
