

Nationally 89.9% of schools were rated B or above for condition. Based on the 2019 pupil census figures, 3,219 primary pupils were educated in school buildings rated as poor (46.1% of primary school roll). 2,467 secondary pupils were educated in school buildings rated as poor (49.9% of secondary roll).
