Work in Lossiemouth is most developed and is at stage five with the community consultation completed and analysis ongoing The work in Forres and Keith is at stage 2 of 8 with local anchor organisations identified and early scoping work ongoing in Forres and Keith Work is more intense in the earlier stages where groups are being formed and consultation and data analysis are happening. 	60%

A Communications and Engagement Officer and Community Liaison Officer have also been assigned to support the Learning Estate Team with Findrassie and wider ASG engagement and consultation activities. Findrassie Primary School Project Consultation on the Findrassie primary school design brief final draft is planned to commence when schools return from holidays in mid-Aug. Initial engagements will be with a newly established Primary School Head Teachers Focus Group and other Education Services specialist providers (e.g. ELC, ASN). A full community engagement on the new Primary School is planned to complete by late Sep 21. The final design brief will inform detailed design development by the appointed design team in Oct 21. Decisions and consultation on rezoning of catchment areas to incorporate the new Findrassie primary school are planned take place in 2022. Engagement with Scottish Futures Trust (SFT) continues on a regular basis in support of the Findrassie primary school project, a Learning Estate Improvement Programme (LEIP) Phase 2 approved project. The project is now aligned with the SFT project development process and a quarterly Status Evaluation Form was submitted in Jun 21. A Critical Success Factors workshop was completed with SFT in May 21 and there is ongoing engagement to develop SMART objectives within the current RIBA Stage 1: Preparation and Brief Stage before then end of Aug 21. Further support will be sought from SFT subject matter experts to develop a robust project quality assurance plan. 			Learning Estate Strategy ASG Level Engagement and Consultation Associated School Group (ASG) level stakeholder consultation on options for the Learning Estate is planned to start in Sep. Engagement covering the four priority ASGs – Buckie, Forres, Elgin HS and Elgin Academy – will take 6 months to complete – following which detailed options appraisals will be developed for these. The remaining ASG engagements – Keith, Lossiemouth, Milnes and Speyside - will take a further 6 months and complete Aug 22. Anticipated LEIP Phase 3 project grant submission request later this year will require early decisions on options for Buckie and Forres ASGs. An option to appoint HubNorth Scotland to provide consultancy to inform these decisions has been accepted by CMT and council leaders and approval is with Committee.		
			School Core Condition Property planning to commence an overdue full condition survey of all Moray schools in Aug 21; it is anticipated will take 2 years to complete. This will inform asset management decisions to achieve and maintain Condition B standards across all schools, as well as Learning Estate capital investment options appraisals following ASG engagement and consultation.
