3.	Public Session	
	Nikki Howard (Assistant Event Director) Scottish 6 Days orienteering event briefed the	
	meeting. The event will be from 30 July to 4 August. Day 1 29th July event centre will be in	
	Town Hall with a 5-hour window to collect badges. Events will also be held in Lossiemouth,	
	Darnaway, Roseisle (Burghead) and Culbin. A small urban event will be held on Wed 2 nd	
	Aug at Forres Academy. Residents have been advised. In total 2400 entered. Any	
	questions can be emailed to Nikki. 150 campervans are booked and struggling to find	
	parking, but these will be based at the Academy and campers will be bused to Roseisle	
	and Culbin. Finish will be on Roysvale.	
	Website Scottish6days.com There will also bike orienteering Sanquhar, Altyre and Quarrywood. Turfing will also be	
	taking place.	
	Local businesses will be reminded of the events nearer the time.	
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Discussion took place on the issue of the roadworks and lights causing congestion on Grantown Road. Blocking some of the lights has helped. SGN have said more staff would be provided, if necessary, but the work is on schedule at present. Sandra McLennan advised that Forres in Bloom judging would be the second week of August and requested help with the following: 1. Condition of roundabouts on A96. Could council contact Amey about this? 2. Mature trees cut down at the Market Green beds and wondered why this happened. 3. Auchernack – something seems to have happened with purchase of the building and the grounds have not been maintained. Could the grounds be tidied up. Cllr McBain will follow up 1 and 2 above. Just Transition participatory budgeting will launch on 26th June in Elgin Town Hall. Information event to be held in Forres House Community Centre on Wednesday 12th July from 3-8pm. Max £50,000 per application. A question was raised regarding a Moray Council employee with a measuring clicker near Grant Park. The meeting was told that they are looking at a proposal to widen the pavement in front of Catholic Church to create cycling path. KSk advised that Active Travel Forres are exploring options to connect all the primary schools including a route through town centre. Cllr McBain stated that options would consider how school children can travel to school in a safe manner, and nothing is on or off the table. Discussion followed but it was noted that any concerns need to be taken to the Active Travel group not FCC as the meeting doesn't have sufficient information to comment. Forres Osprey Bus – Still in discussion with MC regarding parking, e-chargers and rent rebate on the existing garage - no solution has yet been found. King's Coronation - Cost of hall and expenses £320 so JL will arrange for unspent balance JL to be returned to Forres Common Good. Planning/Licences 6. a. Planning No contentious applications for Forres. **Action Plan Updates** 7. 1. Flooding/Resilience Plan JI stated that we seem to be back to square one following recent heavy rainfall. He has been in talks with Scottish Water (SW) over the last 3 to 4 weeks and contacted various householders. SW will be doing surveys and put cameras through all drains. All the information gathered, along with photos have been sent to SW. Bogton and Sanguhar Road have experienced problems over the last 2 years which appears to be a new area affected. Applegrove playground was covered in sewage. SF is acting on this with SEPA and Cllr Robertson is working on this as well. 2. Resilience leaflet is delayed until safe space is identified. The Community Centre is MC's safe place so not appropriate. Alternatives could be the Tolbooth, but access is not great, so the Town Hall proposed as temporary first safe space. MC is producing a Moray wide resilience leaflet. Correspondence 8. None to note 9. Treasurer's Report There was no treasurers report.

Cllr McBain – gave a brief on what a fortnight looks like for a Councillor and all the meetings that are involved. Briefing on way forward - £20 million in red to find in 2 years. Looking to see where savings could be made within the council but not in services. He has asked for a report to go back to council on the Forres Academy inspection before the date of the next inspection to see what the challenges are. There will be a paper in December/January to check progress. No more information on new school from Scottish Govt. Applied to get lead funding for Forres and Buckie and awaiting the outcome. Earliest for the new school will be late 2026/27.

Attends parents' meetings when invited. Had been to Kinloss but not invited to Forres Academy. KSk will ensure an invite is sent to Paul for future parents' meetings at Academy. Airbnb – not a lot of applications for the new registration system have been received to date.

12. **AOCB**

Garden room planning application. Lorna Creswell (LC) presented a proposal to install access to the walled area adjacent to the Garden Room. The building is 50 years old at end of December and was built from Common Good assets. Group of staff and volunteers are raising money for access to courtyard. Regulations have changed to require 2 points of access, so they are looking at other funding opportunities. FCC were asked to front an application to the Newbold Trust (23rd June deadline) and Forres Common Good. Estimate for 2 doors is £5500 but this doesn't include the ramps. It is hoped that MC will waiver the warrant which has now expired.

KSk proposed that we accept LC's proposal to front the application.

DP seconded. All 5 CCs voted for the proposal. JL to be the contact.

LC pulling together a group to look at how to celebrate 50th anniversary.

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Website – JL asked CCs to submit suggestions for pages and information needed for new website.

DP – M96 bus service – fast service between Inverness and Aberdeen. Timetable circulated.
