1.	Welcome and apologies: The Chair welcomed all to the meeting. Apologies were recorded as above. The Chair started with a public thanks for the Fireworks and Remembrance Parades. Firstly, a thank you to the Rotary Club for the Fireworks which was attended by an estimated 4000. The Royal British Legion was thanked for the Remembrance Parade. Thanks also recorded for all the youngsters and their youth leaders that participated in the Parade.	
2.	Community Safety Report: The CSP for October has been circulated. SF went through the report. KSk will find out more details on the shop lifting. Discussion took place on this, but care must be taken in drawing assumptions from data as it doesn't provide a full picture reflecting only the number of incidents reported. A shop owner in Forres has reported number of cars parked on zigzags. An email had been received about this and JL will forward this to PC Aaron White, Community Officer. Parking for the fireworks caused a problem this year with cars parked on verges, pavements, etc. SF has written to the Rotary about this, and they will include it in the wash up. It was noted that traffic cones had been placed on pavements rather than the road which reduced the width of paths. Placing then in the road encourages traffic to slow down. It was proposed that the Academy car park could be used in future and consideration of a small park and ride could be an option using the Osprey buses. KSk/JL will progress this.	JL KSk./JL

	JCC meeting feedback	
	a. Moray Woodlands and Forest Strategy 2023. SF outlined the strategy paper that had	
	been tabled at the JCC. There are questions for CC's answer about local woodlands.	
	Following discussion, it was agreed that groups already working in Forres should be	
	involved. JL will forward the paper to the Sanquhar volunteer group, Forres Woodland	JL
	Trust and Forres Friends of Woods and Fields (FFWF) for their consideration.	
	b. Trees near Nelsons Tower have been felled. FFWF will be replanting the area once	
	brush cleared doing replanting.	
	c. Integrated maternity services improvement plan. SF outlined the programme timeline	
	for provision of maternity services to December 2026. FG will check whether the	FG
	information is available in the Health Centre.	
	d. Moray Council has drafted an expenses policy for CC's which can be modified and	
	adopted as required. It emphasises that anyone who is a Cllr shouldn't be out of	
	pocket. SF will circulate a copy for consideration and discussion at the next meeting.	SF
	e. Funding model for CC's in Moray. The admin grant is awarded based on a formula that	
	takes into consideration population therefore larger areas get more funding. However,	
	some CCs must pay rent for accommodation which can use up the whole grant leaving	
	no funds for things like paying a secretary. Discussion took place on this as FCC	
	doesn't use its full grant. A questionnaire will be sent to CCs about expenditure and a	
	discussion will be held on this and how to support smaller CC's. GM has agreed to be	
	part of this discussion group.	
	f. Outdoor Gym – this is being opened at 1pm on 1st December by the Lord Lieutenant	
	DP will attend on behalf of FCC.	
	g. Website – BS is still working on this on our behalf, and it will hopefully go live before	
	Christmas. All CCs are asked to send a photo and short bio to Ben as soon as	ALL

	15 th November and returned to MC who will award the contract on 29 th November to	
	start December. This is to develop the capital bid for delivery of cultural & heritage

Treasurer's Report Balance 18th September - £7720.30. Statement of accounts submitted to Debra. Claims for expenses and honorarium still to be paid. 10. Moray councillor reports Cllr Robertson – Consultation is live on budget proposals and libraries and leisure, and all are encouraged to complete. RAAC update at 6pm on 29th November in the Town Hall to discuss phase 2. It was noted that the young people have so resilient being taken to Lossie, UHI and Moray College for lessons. The staff have been amazing as they currently have no staff room. Confirmation of funding has been announced for the new school. MC has received the Gold award for Armed Forces Covenant. Moray is the top local authority in Scotland for recycling. Andersons Primary received a really good report. Cllr Lawrence - There is a new Town Centre capital grant scheme for shop owners who can apply for up to £50k (50% match funding required) to encourage businesses to remain in town. He will forward the link giving details to JL to circulate. He has written a letter to the Director of Creative Scotland responding to recent comments about amount of funding going to Findhorn. Cllr McBain – Attended Public Dev and Infrastructure, Licensing committee and Licensing Review body which addresses planning disputes. He had attended 3 memorial services -Whitley Memorial, Dyke and Forres. He was disappointed that the protocol of laying wreaths wasn't followed in correct order. SF thanked the Cllrs for attending the recent meeting with TTF and Head of Corporate Finance Committee. It had cleared up misconceptions about funding and rents. TTF were pleased with outcome of the meeting so will now work with officers to move this forward. Councillors were asked if a decision had been made on how to spend the £15,000 awarded.
