MONTH OF THE MILITARY CHILD

COMMUNITIES JOINED FORCES TO CELEBRATE

April is globally recognised as the Month of the Military Child (MotMC), a time dedicated to celebrating children and young people from military families. Growing up as a child of a serving parent or parents can entail a unique lifestyle, including coping with challenges such as parental absence during deployments, living a transient lifestyle and the need to be resilient and adaptable to changes. The Month of the Military Child aims to raise awareness and show our appreciation to these children and their families.

Schools in Moray celebrated MotMC in many inclusive ways; it was amazing to see communities come together to celebrate Moray's Armed Forces children. The Dandelion Project and schools held events to celebrate, including: poetry workshops, bake sales, 'Purple Up' days, assemblies and competitions. Did you spot the monuments that lit up purple especially for MotMC? Reading Force's Fiona visited Moray to join the Dandelion Project for 'Books and Blether' drop-ins in Kinloss and Elgin over two-days, children were delighted with their free book!

The charity <u>Never Such Innocence</u> delivered nine workshops across seven schools in Moray, to a mixture of Armed Forces and non-Armed Forces pupils. It was an absolute joy to work with Nik Perring (author); pupils thrived in his 'Voices of Armed Forces Children' poetry workshops.



Listening to the Lossiemouth Military Wives Choir perform at two 'Purple Up' assemblies was truly touching, nurturing a sense of community spirit. Month of the Military Child was also celebrated at Moray Council HQ. To support Armed Forces families in Moray, the local SSAFA Community Service Team and the Dandelion Project organised a 'Purple Up' bake sale at HQ, raising a total of £445.57!

A huge well done to everyone who played a part in raising awareness of the Month of the Military Child and for taking part in the celebrations. A special thank you to the partners who supported Moray and its schools in creating such memorable experiences.

D-DAY 80

FIND OUT MORE ABOUT THE 80TH ANNIVERSARY AND HOW TO MARK THE DATE IN SCHOOL

On 6 June 1944, thousands of American, British and Canadian troops landed on the beaches in Normandy, France. They were there to fight back and free France, Belgium and the Netherlands from Germany, who had taken over. The operation would become known as D-Day. It was a huge turning point in World War 2 and this year marks the 80th anniversary of D-Day. On 5-6 June 1944, RAF personnel from 617 Squadron dropped aluminium foil from 16 Lancasters as a decoy to persuade the Germans that an Allied invasion of the Pas de Calais was imminent.

The spoof invasion, part of Operation Taxable and a key component of broader deception plan Operation Bodyguard, was executed at the same time as the genuine landings. The overall deception played a major role in the success of the D-Day landings. Help us pay homage to the 80th anniversary of **D-Day** by taking part in our **Tin Foil**
