

Meeting Minutes

Meeting on Thursday 1st August 2024 at Edinkillie Hall

1) Minutes of previous meeting

Minutes agreed.

2) Current Standing Items

a) Traffic Safety in Rafford

• Provision of a pavement in Upper Rafford

Construction works complete, but some snagging items to be tackled. Elaine Penny, Roads Engineer, to propose some road markings at crossing points.

• Vehicle Activated Signs

PT reported he was still waiting for a response from JCC to the question of insurance of CC owned assets. (Action: PT to follow up)

• Village Entrance Signs

HD reported that he had followed up with Elaine Penny and Landowner on land for the Village Entrance sign at the south end of Upper Rafford. Elaine has agreed to mark out the area of the field needed for the sign, which the owners will review. (Action: HD to follow up)

b) Broadband

R100

TH that the ongoing roadworks from St Leonards Road on Forres to Upper Rafford for the installation of ducting, are due to be completed by 9th August. He also reported that some additional ducting is due to be installed down Old Road from the south then along to Redhill. TH added that the fibre cables would be installed into the ducting at a later date. Additional road works and cabinets would be needed to hook up to individual properties. (no planning permission needed)

HD reported that he had seen the completion dates slip from April to June 2025 on Digital Scotland Address Checker for R100. It was agreed to write to R Lochhead to query this. (Action: HD)

CM queried a request to install cable or ducting along the track from Rafford Church to Granary Farm. (Action: TH to follow up)



External Reality

TH noted that ER had looked further at the possibility of wireless backhaul to provide a temporary connection to Upper Rafford, but it had proved infeasible.

c) Brockloch Field Development

TP reported that further landscaping drawings had been submitted at the request of TMC Planning department.

d) Windfarm Developments

HD reported an update from EDF on meeting with Community Energy Moray held in mid-June.

- EDF are working on creating a comprehensive community investment portfolio across its portfolio, including Clashgour.
- EDF will be launching a local sponsorship fund later this year enabling groups with Moray to apply for a share of a pot of money.
- A further supply chain engagement event to be held in 2025.

e) Joint Community Council

Next meeting 8th August. (Action: PT to attend)

f) Resilience Planning

PT had circulated a draft outline of a Resilience Plan to CC members to review. (Action: all CC members)

PT raised some issues to be addressed:

- Any equipment bought by FCC would need insurance cover
- Village Halls should be contacted regarding possible storage of Resilience Equipment
- Contact Forres CC, regarding their experience and lending out of their Resilience equipment.

g) Forres Health Services

TH reported that an email has been sent including the questions for the NHS Forres Locality Planning Group that were agreed in the previous FCC meeting.

A further question was discussed, following problems encountered by a West Coast pharmacy trying to contact Forres Health Centre regarding the supply of urgently needed drugs for a Forres patient: "What facilities are in place to allow other professional bodies, such as pharmacies, to contact the Forres Health Centre, without having to wait in the general queue for the phone to be answered?"

(Action: TH to follow up)



3) Matters Arising from Previous Minutes

a. A940 Road Junction at Edinkillie Church

AM reported problems with drainage at the new road layout, with increasing run-off onto the road. vehicles. It was agreed that AM should phone PT when the road is flooded, so pictures can be taken, and forwarded to TMC Roads Dept. (Actions: AM, PT)

b. FCC membership

HD reported that the position of voluntary Minute Secretary has been advertised with TSI Moray.

It was agreed that futter efforts to attract new members were required:

- The recruitment poster to be refreshed including purpose of the FCC and level of commitment needed. (Action: TP)
- RP recommended face-to-face contact with potential members, and suggested FCC attendance at community events such as Rafford Village Café and Edinkillie Cake and Cuppa. (Action: all CC members)

c. Local Place Plans

TP reported that, following the June quarterly JCC LPP meeting, that the deadline for submission of LPPs had been delayed until January 2025.

TP offered to make an application to FDT for funding to engage Collective Architecture, who have experience in putting together an LPP for Findhorn Village. (Action: TP)

d. Lower Rafford Mini-Wetland

TH reported he had emailed TMC.

e. Path to Rafford Church

HD reported that he had met with Mike MacDonald to discuss the work involved. TH had agreement to use to use the Glebe field as a collection point for material removed. TH suggested a September/October timescale for organising a work party and agreed to co-ordinate this.

(Action: TH)

f. Road to Rafford Cemetery

HD reported he had written to TMC Parks and Road Department, asking for their help in repairing the short section of road from Kirkside to the Church Car Park. (Action: HD to follow up)

g. Fish Ladder at Lower Rafford Bridge

TH reported that he has cleared the fish ladder.

 New house at Old Road Rafford – not yet determined. TH reported that Planning had requested a tree survey report.
