



<u>CHILD FRIENDLY PRIVACY NOTICE</u> <u>Children's Services Partnership –</u> <u>Moray SONAS Wellbeing Service</u>

Introduction

A Privacy Notice tells you how we use personal information, so you know what happens with it when you give it to us. This is our Child Friendly Privacy Notice about the information we collect about you for the <u>Moray SONAS Wellbeing Service</u>. An adult version of the Privacy Notice is online here: <u>www.Moray.gov.uk/PrivacyNotices</u>. **Action for Children** provide this SONAS service for the Council, so will collect information from you on our behalf.

Who we are

We are Moray Council, we offer lots of services to people who live in Moray. We help your school to function, make sure you have a local library service and provide care for people who need it. Moray Council are also part of Moray's Children's Services Partnership, who work together to support children in Moray.

What we do with your personal data

Personal data, or personal information, is information that can identify you, like your name, address or email address.

Some types of information we need to be extra careful with; this is known as 'special category data'. This could be something like information about your health, or what religion you are.

Why we are collecting your personal data

Personal data will be collected when you take part in SONAS: the Children and Young Adults Mental Wellbeing Service so that we can get in touch with you and your family to as part of this family support service.

Personal data about you that we collect from other people

We (the Council), or Action for Children might collect information about you from someone else, such as your doctor, someone at your school, or a family member if they have made a referral about you to Action for Children so that you can take part in the Moray SONAS Wellbeing Service.

Data Protection Law

We always make sure we follow legal rules when we use your information. The Council does this as part of our public task. We have responsibilities under Getting It Right For Every Child (GIRFEC), the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014 and the Local Government (Scotland) Act 2003. The Moray SONAS Wellbeing Service has been set up to help us meet our duties under our public task; to promote and improve the well-being of people within Moray. To help us improve your well-being, the SONAS Service may ask for extra personal information, like about your health – this type of information is called 'special category data'.

Who we share your information with

Your information will be shared with Action for Children who will be providing the SONAS Service for the Council. We make sure that they process your personal data correctly through our contract with them. We also share numerical information with Scottish Government about the SONAS Service, we don't share any information with them that could identify you.

Sometimes in order to do our work, and provide support to you, we have to share your personal data with other services in the Council, or with your school, or, family or with the Police or fire service. We are careful about how we do this and always follow the rules.

How long we keep your information

We only keep it for as long as we need it. Sometimes this might be years. We have a page on our website that tells you how long we keep different types of information: <u>available here</u>

We keep information in the UK.

Your rights

You have special rights about what we can do with your information. One of these is the right to know what we do with it (that's what this notice is for).

You also have the right to ask us what information we have about you, if we could stop using it, and, if we could delete it. You can ask us to correct your information if it is wrong.
