	Elgin Academy was highlighted as being a particular hot	
	spot, with many birds nesting across the roof space.	
	Douglas mentioned that one of his neighbours was a drone	Douglas
	operator – Douglas will talk to him to see if he might conduct	
	a fly-over to ascertain bird numbers at the Academy.	
	Anne told those present that she was recently attacked and	
	defecated on by a gull near her home, her clothes were	
	binned.

	It is a four week programme but currently running a week			
	behind due to recent weather conditions. They have been			
	clearing 1.5tonnes of litter and detritus each day.			
	Cllr Keith is going on a street walk with the programme manager on Thursday.			
	Over 10yrs the street cleaning machines have decreased			
	from 9 double manned machines to 3 single manned			
	machines. This has been notable around our housing			
	estates where weeds and pile of detritus are often found			
	along the kerb lines.			
11.	Planning approval has been granted for the next phase at			
Elected Members	Findrassie and for the site at Bilbohall (west)			
12. AOCB	A group of travellers had recently occupied the hard			
	standing area at Deanshaugh park, it is not clear if they had
