7.Elgin Christmas lights.	Elgin Benevolent fund are donating £2.5k of left over funds, crowd funder has raised £1.3k and sponsorship of the trees a further £1.4k. There is a minefield of paperwork to be submitted and plenty of hoops to jump through in the process. We are making progress slowly but getting there.	
8. Resilience	Placed on hold until we begin the new term of the ECC. Hopefully there will be sufficient interest in taking this forward.	New Term
9. Seagulls	FINALLY! A date for the summit has been announced. It is to be held on Tuesday 23 rd of September in Great Glen House, Inverness. As yet no time has been given nor any formal invites received, these apparently are coming from Nature Scot. There are still a number of young gulls going about, but during the day it has been noted that a large number of gulls disappear presumably to find food.	
10 Deep clean	Councillor Keith mentioned that a further £5k has been added to the deep clean fund. The clean has been ongoing for a number of weeks and will continue for a few more. Alison mentioned that the waste bins on the High Street could also be doing with a good clean.	
11. Elected Members	The elected members present gave oral updates on recent council meetings and activities. These included but not limited to – The Cooper Park has gone out to the planners to come up with a design/layout for the park. Investment in core paths for improvement works using monies from the Durnell wind farm, and work with the police following a recent increase in fatal RTC's across Moray.	
12. Community Council Elections	This is the final meeting of the 2021-2025 term for Community Councils across Moray. The nomination papers will be available from the 3 rd of October with the election process going live on Monday 6 th of October for a period of 15days closing on Tuesday 21 st of October at 4pm the results will be known later that week. Members planning to stand again were reminded to complete the nomination forms and to get them in as soon as possible. If there are more candidates than places available (18 in Elgin) then it will go to a vote. In this case anyone thinking they could just get co-opted may lose out if there are no spaces hence get the nominations in.

15. AOCB	The application submitted by Aldi in respect of a move to Edgar Road (Elgin Retail Park) was withdrawn in January 2025	
	Mentioning the introduction of the 20mph zones prompted some discussion around the Bishopmill Bridge which is to close for 5 weeks in October for much needed maintenance. Traffic coming from the west side will be diverted via Morrison Road turning in at the Eight Acres, Where as those coming in from the East will be diverted via New mill and Lesmurdie Road from the Pansport roundabout.	
	Trees in the River Lossie should be removed under the flood alleviation scheme (funds laid down for such purposes) The flood alleviation manager is to look into and take action regarding the 'silt island' which has grown in the river below the Landshut Bridge.
