

Innes Community Council

Minutes of Meeting held on 7th April 2026 in Lhanbryde Community Centre at 7,30 p.m.

1. Sederunt: T. Christie (Chair), S. Anderson (V.Chair), DG Mackay (Sec.), C. Dunbar (Treas.) , A. Bodman, C. Perkins, P. Fitch, K. Henderson, G. Perkins.
2. Apologies: Clrs. M. Macrae, S. Morrison, B. Williams,
3. Council Report: None available. (No councillors)
4. Police report; A newsletter has been received from PS with a local action update. Also a proposal that CCs offer PS two dates in a year, where officers would be able to attend CC Meetings. All agreed that this is better than nothing and to arrange said two dates.
5. Minutes of Last Meeting (13.03. 2026); These were accepted as a true and accurate record: Proposed: P. Fitch, Seconded : C. Perkins.
6. Matters Arising from # 5: An email had been received via TMC that ICC,s observations on the Balfour Beattie development at Milltown airfield expressed an 'anti- development' attitude. The Secretary had responded clarifying that ICC's concerns were not anti- development, but extreme concern over three exit/egress points on a busy road, where one would appear to make more sense, properly constructed. No response has yet been received.
7. Correspondence: A letter had been received from Debbie Halliday, TMC, concerning the Spey viaduct. ICC expressed concern that after earlier assurances from TMC that ICc would be kept up to date and 'in the loop', information about

the progress of plans for the Viaduct were received after the event. There fore not giving ICC the opportunity to comment. (Sec. to make enquiries) . Questions were also asked as to why the removal of structure damaged has been given to a firm in Airdrie, and not a local business (qualified in the work required.)

8. Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer reported that ICC has £1404.57 on account with the BoS. The half yearly CC grant has been received from TMC.
9. Resignation: The Chair stated that a letter of resignation has been received from Jim Mackie citing personal reasons. The ICC agreed that Jim's remarkable research skills will be sadly missed, and all agreed that he had given ICC many years of good service. The secretary is to reply to Jim, accepting his note on behalf of ICC, and mention the above details.
10. Spey Viaduct: Up date as noted in #7. There is a Meeting of stakeholders (limited) in Garmouth GC on 19th April. Chair, DM and AF to attend. NS will be present for G & K CA.
11. SSEN: SSEN are proposing several new sub stations in Moray. One of these, possibly two, will be in the ICC area and Secretary is to ask the project Manager Gordon McGuffie to attend the next Meeting to clarify the proposal.
12. Lhanbryde Garden Club: following on from DM's suggestion that ICC should make a donation to the Club, who put in a great deal of effort to give Lhanbryde hanging baskets and floral beds, ICC agreed to donate fifty pounds per year for the next three years. Proposed: DG Mackay, Seconded: C. Dunbar.
13. AOCB: CP reported that the traffic and other issues are still prevalent in the Loch Oire area, and he has a good rapport

with MSP Richard Lohead. Agreed to keep the issue in the active list.

The disputed area of ground next to Mosstodloch Service Station (Moss services / Crown estates:) Bidwells, as agents for CES are meeting with the proprietor of MS on 5th May to discuss options. (MS would like to install 5/6 EV charging points.)

The Chair thanked all for attending and called for the next Meeting to be held on Tuesday 5th May in Urquhart Parish Hall) at 7.30 p.m. (Sec: Hopefully ! They do not answer Emails!)
