

Elgin Town Centre – Plainstones

Conditions of Use

Please refer to the attached plan of the Elgin Centre.

1. In terms of the Traffic Order which regulates the movement of traffic within the pedestrianised area around St. Giles Church, no vehicles should enter that area between the hours of 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. and therefore any traffic movements associated with the event should be undertaken outwith the times stipulated.
2. No vehicles are permitted to be driven on the north side of High Street (i.e. Clydesdale Bank side) between North Street and Commerce Street at any time.
3. You are required not to park any vehicle or place any structure or object upon the mosaic, which lies within the Plainstones and is marked with a 'X'.
4. No access to the Plainstones is permitted before 7 a.m. on the day of use.
5. Fire hydrants must be kept clear of any obstruction at all times.
6. As the emergency access to the Clydesdale Bank side of the High Street is between the War Memorial and the Fountain, this area must be kept clear of stalls.
7. No entertainment or other authorised activity should be permitted to proceed on the Plainstones at least 45 minutes prior to a funeral or 30 minutes prior to a wedding taking place within the St. Giles Church.
8. Noise from music must be monitored and kept at a reasonable level.
9. The whole area must be kept clean and tidy and the accumulation of any litter removed.
10. During fundraising for charitable events, the name of the charity benefiting from the proceeds must be displayed prominently in the area.
11. You are required to have a valid certificate of insurance indemnifying The Moray Council of any liability to persons or property arising out of any incident connected with the event.
12. Electrical power boxes are provided within the area of the Plainstones. Application Forms for use of this energy are available from John Philips, Roads Lighting Engineer, telephone Elgin 562532/Cynthia Carswell, Administration Officer, telephone Elgin 563014.
13. **Please note that if for any reason you have completed an Electrical Supply Form and do not use the supply you must inform us of this as a matter of urgency otherwise you will be charged for the electricity you quoted.**
14. Separate permission is required for trading, public charitable collections, processions, erection of banners and other activities for which a licence is required from The Moray Council.
15. Use of the Plainstones for religious, political or commercial purposes is forbidden and any exception to this would require to be specifically approved by The Moray Council.
