SUBJECT: ELGIN TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT - CAPITAL PLAN

REASON FOR REPORT

- 1.1 To seek Committee approval for a number of projects in the Capital Plan as detailed in the report.
- 1.2 This report is submitted to Committee in terms of the Council's Administrative Scheme relating to consideration of the Capital and Revenue budgets.

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee approve the expenditure for the Elgin Traffic Management Capital projects for the 3 year period detailed in this report.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The Core Capital Plan for 2009-2010 was approved at the Special Meeting of The Moray Council on 12 February 2009 as part of the Financial Plan for 2009-10 (Para 3 of the Minute refers). Under the terms of that report, all Capital Plan allocations are subject to detailed reports submitted to and approved by the relevant Service Committee.
- 3.2 Reference is also made to The Policy and Resources Committee of 7 April 2009 (Para 7 of the Minute refers). The Committee approved the re-profiling of the Capital Plan item for Elgin Traffic Management to the following:

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Elgin Traffic Management – sub projects

- 3.3 The budgets approved at Policy and Resources on 7 April are made up from identified sub-projects, each of which further the overall key planning objective of "providing a quicker, safer and more reliable transport system in and around Elgin while accommodating future development" adopted by the Elgin STAG in 2007. A description of each sub-project is provided in subsequent paragraphs.
- 3.4 Reports to Economic Development and Infrastructure Committee of 3 February 2009 (Paras 6 and 19 of the minute refers), approved the procurement and award of a new Framework Agreement for transportation and design services, and confirmed that investigations into Options A & B of a Western Distributor Road should continue.
- 3.5 Within the detail of the report to Policy and Resources committee on 7 April 2009, members were advised that the Elgin High School sports project requires the construction of a suitable access route off the end of Edgar Road, that the Elgin traffic model was out of date and requires to be updated allowing analysis of traffic flows and the impact assessments of the development plan and private sector applications, and finally that the car parking strategy could be advanced once the Framework Agreement consultants were appointed. The report also updated on the unsuccessful bid for funding against the *Smarter Choices, Smarter Places* sustainable travel demonstration towns fund, and the fact that a decision on the parallel bid for European funding for the project was awaited.
- 3.6 Wherever possible, application for additional match funding will be progressed. The extension of Edgar Road / Access to the High School may be eligible for European funding as part of a bid covering the sports, leisure and training improvements at the school. The guidance for this funding suggests that to be eligible for consideration, construction cannot start before April 2010.
- 3.7 The following describes the sub-projects to be taken forward over the next 3 financial years 2009/10 to 2011/12:

Description:	Extension of Edgar Road to service High School Sports
hall project (a	and 1 st phase of Options A or B road project)

Details: 2009/10 2010/11 2011/12

The planned works at the High School require the construction of a suitable access road off the end of Edgar Road. This extension will partially service the access requirements for either option A or B, the affordable housing at Bilbohall and a link to the west – for either future private housing or a link road to the option B line.

Detailed design and planning application for the extension of Edgar Road and access to the school. The works will not be prejudicial to any of the Western Distributor Road options but equally will not result in significant abortive work as a consequence of the selection of any of the options.

<u>Description</u>: Development of Western Distributor Road options A & B.

Details: 2009/10 2010/11 2011/12

Procurement of consultancy framework contract and the further development of the options with a view to producing a robust proposal.

Advance design work on Western Distributor and Edgar Road extension.

<u>Description</u>: Ground Investigation for Roads projects, High School Sports hall development and Affordable Housing site.

Details: 2009/10 2010/11 2011/12

Carry out appropriate preliminary ground investigation for these projects to determine feasibility of proposals and design requirements.

Sustainable Travel – sub projects

- 3.8 **Smarter Choices, Smarter Places** sustainable travel demonstration towns funding was offered to all local authorities in Scotland via a competitive bid process. Moray Council was successful in reaching the second round and submitted a detailed project outline to the Scottish Government in July 2008, but this bid proved to be unsuccessful in the later stages. Bids were invited on the basis of match funding over a three year period. A summary of the financial details of the bid is shown in **Appendix A**. The Council's matching contribution was envisaged from a parallel bid for European funding, but with certain ineligible infrastructure and service upgrades at Elgin railway station removed. This bid has remained live, and whilst final confirmation is still awaited, the 40% funding of the project from the EU Grant has been announced for the 3 year period.
