This house has been left to rot, and what guarantee is there that they will indeed restore that house once they have built these others? Anyone could have bought this property without the capital to restore it, but it was said at the time that the big house would have to be restored first before other buildings were completed. Yet these people without even touching Newton House, have already been allowed to build 3 properties, with no sign of any further protection to prevent Newton House falling in completely.
