GUIDANCE NOTES

- 1. For a Light Duty Scaffold over 2 lifts (5.0 m high) a Design Certificate will only be accepted if signed by an advanced scaffolder or a person whose qualifications, training and experience are deemed acceptable by the Transportation Manager.**
- 2. For General Purpose and Heavy Duty Scaffolds, etc, a Design Certificate will only be accepted if signed by a scaffolding designer or a person whose qualifications are deemed acceptable by the Transportation Manager.**
- 3. A new Design Certificate must be supplied for any change in the structure of the scaffolding.**
- 4. Before putting the scaffolding into use a Certificate of Completion of Erection must be signed and returned with application. Reasonable opportunity must be given to staff to inspect the site prior to any occupation by the user.**
