

Elgin is twinned with the Bavarian city of Landshut and in homage to this the new bridge at Pansport will be formally named the 'Landshut Bridge'

WHAT HAS BEEN DONE SO FAR?

- Pansport Cottage was demolished to make space for the flood defences and also provided a location for the temporary bridge
- The temporary bridge is complete and fully operational
- Demolition of the existing Pansport Bridge has commenced
- Utilities have been diverted under the river via directional drilling
- The new Pansport Bridge is currently being fabricated in Darlington by Cleveland Bridge UK
- Pansport Rose Garden and Kingsmill Play Park are being used for construction material storage

WHAT IS STILL TO BE DONE?

- The demolition of the existing bridge is to be completed
- The new bridge is to be constructed
- The temporary bridge will be removed
- The Rose Garden and Kingsmill Play Park (a reduced size) will be returned to their former uses following the completion of the works
- North College Street will be fully re-opened following completion of the bridge works

HOW MIGHT IT AFFECT ME?

- The temporary bridge allows continued access across the river on Pansport Road to reduce disruption to vehicles and pedestrians
- North College Street is currently closed one-way from Cathedral Road to Pansport Road for vehicular access. Occasionally this section of road will be fully closed to allow construction work to take place
- Alternative play parks are available elsewhere in Elgin e.g. Cooper Park
