<p>Description:</p> <p>The team provides a service to adults in Moray who have a learning disability, and to their families and carers.</p> <p>Our aim is to enable all adults with a learning disability to lead as full a life as possible and for them, together with their parents and carers, to reach their full potential.</p> <p>What services do we provide?</p> <p>Helping people with a learning disability to live independently by arranging for support in their own home and in the community.</p> <p>Support people with a learning disability who live with carers by arranging support at home or by providing respite services.</p> <p>Arrange residential care for people with a learning disability who need it.</p> <p>Support people with a learning disability who have specialist health needs.</p> <p>Support people with a learning disability who may have a mental health problem.</p> <p>Help people with both a learning and physical disability to remain as independent as possible.</p> <p>To provide information to people with learning disabilities to help them achieve a healthy lifestyle.</p>
