Thanks for the amended plans. I am still awaiting Transportation's response and will advise you when I receive it.

Without commitment, the principle of some residential development on the site may be considered acceptable. Any such development is clearly complicated by the pronounced slope of the site and the relative narrowness of the area available. Whilst it is appreciated that the application is 'in principle', some indication of the height of building proposed is necessary in order to make the necessary assessment of the proposals. Plots 2 and 3 in particular have a very cramped relationship with the road. Given the smallness of several of the plots the scale of house anticipated would probably have to be constrained. It is noted that the housing to the rear (south) comprises small plots but is predominantly single storey.

On this basis it would be appreciated if sections could be provided across each of the houses showing existing and proposed ground and building levels.
