1	<u>Welcome</u>	
	The Acting Chair, Sandy Anderson, welcomed everyone to the meeting.	
2	Police Report	
	The police report for the Fochabers policing area had been circulated prior to the meeting. This showed that from 2 March to 1 April 2013 there had been a total of 14 crimes reported which related to vandalism, assault, road traffic offences and crimes of dishonesty. Of these 8 had been detected and the offenders reported or warned. Of the 6 that remain undetected 4 have positive lines of enquiry where the suspects have been identified.	
3	Comments/Concerns of the Community	
	Concerns were raised by a resident that the problem with the footpath had not been raised for four months. It was reported that the Moray Council was looking into the issue.	

4. <u>Moray Council Emergency Planning</u>

John Fensome asked that the Community Council follow up on the request that the Heads of the Emergency Services locally meet with the residents of Kingston to advise on the emergency evacuation procedures for Kingston.

3. Brown Muir

The Secretary proposed that the suggestion to set up a Sub Group to look at this matter be established now in the light of new proposals put forward by the company wishing to develop the site. This was seconded by Jim Mackie. David Mackay stressed the need to obtain the views of the community and to try and identify people from outwith the Community Council to serve on the Group. Liz Bodman agreed to serve on the Sub Group, together with David Mackay, Sandy Anderson, Lansana Bangura and Jim Mackie, assisted by John Third. It was agreed to hold a meeting within the next two weeks either in Urquhart or Lhanbryde.

4. Kingston Beach

The Secretary advised that the minutes of the first Sub Group meeting held on 20 March 2013 had been circulated. The group is currently gathering

information on the situation. Recently surveyors from Dingwall have been visiting the site. The Sub Group is also looking at evacuation procedures.

Jim Mackie advised that the Petitions Committee had ruled out his submission. A report had appeared in the Press and Journal and he had submitted a letter to the Editor.

John Fensome reported on his exchange of correspondence with Richard Lochhead. The latest letter from him stated that he was seeking further information concerning the issue from the Chief Executive of Moray Council, Roddy Burn.

Lansana Bangura stated that besides work on the beach, work was also required on the river. Peter Bush proposed that on this issue Innes Community Council should work jointly with Lennox Community Council. This was agreed and Peter agreed to contact them.
