3.	<p>Matters Arising (not on Agenda)</p> <p>3.1 Speed Limit on A96 at Brodie Ongoing, no new information on CMcL to resend letter</p> <p>3.2 20mph-flashing lights in Dyke Now working.</p> <p>3.3 Secretary Posters on Notice Boards have had no effect, advertise in Forres Gazette and Dyke School newsletter. 4.	<p>Scotland Police Report During the past month 4 people have been charged in relation to speeding within the 30mph zone at the Flood Alleviation works. During the past month one person has been charged with possession of cannabis recovered from a car at Brodie. Forensic results are still awaited following the recent break in at Dalvey House.</p>	

5. Flood Alleviation Scheme Presentation

BH and ST gave a very interesting presentation on the progress of the Forres Flood Alleviation Scheme which enabled the members of DLCC to have an over view of progress. The scheme is ahead of schedule and currently under budget. The footbridge over the Findhorn at the Broom of Moy will be closed for 10 weeks from 1 July to allow for the erection of the extension to the bridge. During this time the residents of Broom of Moy will be encouraged to use the Moray Dial a Bus to travel to Forres. Cyclists will be diverted onto the A96 and then either through Dyke or Kintessack. CS expressed her concern at additional cyclists on the road as many of them cycle two and three abreast and will not permit cars to overtake them. NC stated that cyclists should keep to the side of the road and suggested reporting them if they didn't. KM asked whether the daffodils at the side of the A96 would be replaced ST said they would consider this. CMcL thanked BH and ST for the presentation and they and MW left the meeting at this point.
