Exploding Environmental Myths

"The radiators are luke warm so the heating system has broken down".

ANSWER: Many heating systems are fitted with weather compensation control. This monitors the outside temperature and controls the temperature of the water to radiators to avoid overheating. On a very cold day when the outside temperature is -3°C, the hot water temperature might be at 80°C. On a mild day (say 12°C) the hot water temperature might be at 40°C. So if the radiators are warm rather than hot it may well be that the compensator is working correctly! This means your building will not get overheated

Saving Energy and Money at Home

The Moray Council is keen to provide ways for all staff to save money and energy at home as well as at work. Energy bills are often thought of as a cost set in stone, but so many savings can be made from low cost investment or even through simple measures which cost nothing at all! Here are a few ideas before winter really sets in.

How much?

In financial year 2012/13 the Moray Council's energy use emitted 13,923 tonnes of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere.

This amount of carbon dioxide would fill 501,188,613 party balloons or 79,158 double decker buses.
