

enable effect to be given to the said Scheme; and in respect of the undertaking made at the Bar that the Petitioners shall apply the proceeds of the aftermentioned sale for the purposes of the trust authorises the Petitioners to sell and dispose of the dwelling houses numbers 65, 67, 69, 71, 73, 75, 77 and 79 North Port, Elgin erected wholly or partly upon the subjects conveyed by the said Deed of Gift, and Decerns; grants warrant for the registration of an official certified copy of this Interlocutor and a copy of the Scheme as amended and as certified by the agents for the Petitioners in the Books of Council and Session.



## APPENDIX

### SCHEME

1. In this Scheme the following expressions have the following meanings:

"The Deed of Gift" means

the Deed of Gift by the late George Alexander Cooper in favour of the Lord Provost, Magistrates and Councillors of the City and Royal Burgh of Elgin dated 11 and 14 August 1903 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Elgin and Forres (now Moray) on 25th August 1903.

"The subjects" means

the whole subjects conveyed by the late George Alexander Cooper in the said Deed of Gift, under exception of (1) the subjects conveyed to the Secretary of State for Scotland by conveyance in his favour dated 31 March 1993 and recorded in the said Register on 14 April 1993; and (2) that part of the said subjects conveyed by the late George Alexander Cooper lying to the south of Alexandra Road, Elgin.

"The Council" means

Moray District Council and their statutory successors as the local authority responsible for leisure and recreation in the town of Elgin.

2. Upon this Scheme being approved by the Lords and Council of Session and after payment of all charges, debts and expenses incurred in connection with the present application and the administration of the funds

aftermentioned, the Council shall hold the subjects for the following purposes, namely:

- (i) The building presently known as the Drill Hall or T.A.V.R. Building shall be extended and converted into and maintained by the Council as a public lending library and reading room.
  - (ii) The Council shall use Grant Lodge for the benefit of the inhabitants of the town of Elgin, and that by the following means, namely:
    - (a) the Council shall institute and maintain there a local studies centre incorporating the provision of archival and genealogical services (for which a reasonable charge may be made), and the Council may at their option include within the said centre the office of the local Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages and relative wedding room.
    - (b) In so far as Grant Lodge is not in use as a local studies centre as aforesaid, the Council shall refurbish and make the rooms therein (including kitchen, toilet and other facilities) available for social use by individuals, clubs and community groups, and shall be responsible for the maintenance of the premises in good repair and decoration, and the Council may at its option charge a reasonable fee for use of the said rooms.
  - (iii) The remainder of the subjects shall continue to be maintained by the Council as a public park or pleasure ground.
3. In so far as not inconsistent herewith the trust purposes specified in the Deed of Gift shall continue to be given full force and effect.
