	working. S. Noble asked Sylvia for help to encourage two young people to

		meeting. Those who had made representations were given the	
		opportunity to speak but only about the issues raised four years	
		ago. The developer has made changes to the plans meantime.	
		The decision was passed unanimously. Details about developer	
		contribution will be agreed. S. Ferris now has a better	
		understanding of the process and offered to accompany any FCC	
		councillor who may attend similar meetings in future. The first	
		phase will go ahead for 32 units using Drumduan Road for	
		access. A roundabout will then be installed for the building of the	
		remaining units – 249 in total. The junction will be upgraded and	
		traffic calming measures introduced. Developer Contribution may	
		include a 3G pitch beside Forres Academy; a cycle path to Grant	
		Park and recreation areas within the development.	
	11b	Blocked Drains: Cllr Alexander reported that the drains have	
		been cleared and will be monitored when there is heavy rain. E.	
		Hayward has written to The Church of Scotland about the lane	
		beside St Leonard's Church. The reply stated that they are having	
		a problem locating the deeds.	
	11c	Moray Transport Seminar: Several Forres area residents	
		attended. There was an emphasis on Dial a Bus. One issue raised	
		was that the bus has to be booked the previous day. It was agreed	
		to invite the Operations Manager of Stage Coach Moray to attend	
		FCC meeting in January or February.	SN/EH

		Trees on Cluny Hill: The meeting with Ken Kennedy had to be

8. Moray Councillors' Reports:

Cllr Creswell: The Community Centre Cafe is due to open in March after refurbishment and will be run as a training kitchen. Physical and Sensory Disabilities: There will be a meeting in Forres Town Hall on 16th January. Spirit of Community: The report has been circulated and is available on the FACT website. S. Noble asked FCC Cllrs to read and comment at the January meeting. Buses to Health Centre: Funding has been made available to provide an hourly bus service. Merger of Health and Social Care: The plan has to ready for 1st April and the complex work continues including legal issues. Tour of Health Centre: S. Noble will contact Theresa Byrne to arrange a visit for those FCC Cllrs who wish to attend.

Cllr Skene: Dyke and Landward Community Council is now formed and will decide their meeting date. Auchernack Trust: Funds have been distributed and around £800 remains from this allocation. The next date for applications is the end of April and funds will be disbursed in May. S. Noble suggested that FCC may wish to apply for a project. Item for January Agenda. E. Hayward asked about Handy Persons in Elgin and Cllr Creswell replied that the group will come to Forres. School Visits: Cllr Skene has been visiting Additional Support Needs Bases in Elgin. Provision will be enhanced across Moray next year. Education Review: The review continues to address escalating problems with roll increases and difficulties in finding supply staff. St Peter's, Buckie, had to be closed when a virus caused staff absence which could not be met. E. Hayward asked about provision in the light of building at Lochyhill, for example. Western Link Road, Elgin: The full TMC has brought this back to the agenda. A new planning application is to be submitted and Cllr Skene is in support of the decision. E. Hayward asked why TMC is considering such a huge amount of money given that there are plans to dual the A96. Cllr Skene replied that the proposed Link road is not a by-pass but is

CIIr McLEAN: Lochyhills: The planning application has been approved and the Developer Contribution has been agreed and will include improved traffic management; a cycle path to Grant Park and 3G sports provision. Leisure Review: The new membership provision starts in January and will cost £27 per month for family and £19 for individual membership which gives access to any Moray leisure facility. Final decisions about charges will be part of the Budget Review. It does not include entry to Moray Leisure Centre at present because there is no Service Level Agreement to support this. The Moray Council: Kirstie Reid, SNP, has been elected to The Moray Council. There is no overall majority for any group and the Council will have to work together to ensure the best for Moray.
