Dr. Olga Bogdashina, Honorary Professor, Programme Leader (Autism courses: DE, CPD on-line courses), Co-founder. Chief Research Fellow and Lecturer at the International Autism Institute, KSPU; Visiting lecturer in Autism Studies in the UK Universities: Associate Consultant (Autism) to the European Institute of Child Education and Psychology (ICEP Europe), founder of the Autism Society of Ukraine and director of the first Day Centre for autistic children in Gorlovka. Ukraine. She has worked intensively in the field of autism as a teacher. lecturer, researcher and consultant. Olga teaches and lectures in the UK and Europe.

Her particular research interests are sensory perception, cognitive functioning, communication and language development in autism, and spirituality in autism – reflected in the books:

Dr. Jacqui Jackson Biog

Ph.D. (Design)

Dr Jacqui Jackson is a renowned and experienced speaker who addresses topics such as family, education, the criminal justice system, design, employment and sensory issues associated with the autism spectrum.

Jacqui holds a PhD in the field of Design and the impact of the built and digital environment on individuals on the Autism Spectrum. She is also a parent of 8 children and young adults, 5 of whom are on the Autism Spectrum. As a Scientific Advisor and trustee for the leading charity Research Autism, she recognises the importance of sound research into interventions for individuals with an ASD. Moreover, her personal experience of parenting and living with those with an ASD give her a unique insight into autism and related conditions.

Jacqui's family was the subject of 'My family and Autism' in 2005, a documentary which followed the life of Jacqui and her unique family. A subsequent drama, 'Magnificent Seven' was then based on Jacqui's



book, 'Multicoloured Mayhem', where Helena Bonham Carter played Jacqui.

Jacqui is therefore in the position to enlighten, empower and enable professionals, parents, carers and those on the Autism Spectrum by speaking at conferences, seminars and workshops and consulting via Video and Teleconferencing on many aspects of living with autism, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder and related conditions.

Luke Jackson Biog



Coming from a family of eight, many of whom are also on the spectrum, Luke grew up around Autism from a very young age. Diagnosed with Asperger's Syndrome and Dyspraxia himself, he decided to write about his experiences with a view to helping people who live with it too.

Growing up born into a family of eight, many of whom were on the Autism Spectrum themselves, meant Luke gained first-hand experience of what it was like to live with Autism and related conditions. From this experience and his own research, Luke looked at how symptoms of Autism, Asperger's, ADHD and other related conditions manifest, and how some of the more stressful parts can be alleviated. Now in his mid-twenties and currently based in the North of England, he shares his time between writing books and speaking at conferences on the subject of Autism and Asperger's Syndrome and relevant interventions.

The talks and the books both share a common thread; Autism is not a disease or a condition. To quote Freaks, Geeks and Asperger's Syndrome, 'difference is cool', and this is a message that's crucial to changing the way people think about Autism.

After the highly successful (grossing 2.7 million viewers,) BBC documentary 'My Family and Autism', narrated by Luke, him and his family were the focus of the acclaimed television drama 'The Magnificent Seven', starring Helena Bonham Carter.

John Williams Biog

John Williams is a standup comedian. In 2013 he created 'My Son's Not Rainman', a blog and comedy show based on his life as a full-time single dad bringing up his twelve year old son who has autism and cerebral palsy. "It isn't a story about autism", John is keen to point out, "it's a story about a young man who happens to have autism. There's a difference." The show has featured at the Edinburgh Fringe, on BBC Online and Radio 4, and has toured throughout the UK and Europe. The accompanying blog has had over a million hits and is the basis for a book of the same name to be published later in 2015. John is appalling at writing about himself in the third person. He is brilliant at danceoffs.



My Son's Not Rainman is the story of 'The Boy', a twelve year old with autism. He isn't a genius. If he has a 'special power', it's making his Dad laugh. A lot. This is their shared life of magic trains, special school discos and crazy golf by the sea. Set against the backdrop of a long, difficult journey through the education system, ultimately it's just an uplifting story about what it truly means to be different.
