SUBJECT: THEMATIC REVIEW – THE ATTAINMENT AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN

1. REASON FOR REPORT

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to ask Committee to scrutinise a report on a thematic review and approve the follow-up action plan.
- 1.2 This report is submitted to Committee in terms of Section III D (3) of the Council's Administrative Scheme relating to exercising the functions of the Council in respect of looked after children and young people leaving care.

2. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

- 2.1 It is recommended that Committee:
 - scrutinises and notes the contents of the thematic review report (APPENDIX 1); and
 - approves the plan to address the follow-up actions required (APPENDIX 2).

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 At a meeting on 12 December 2012, the Children and Young People's Services Committee scrutinised and endorsed the department's plans for self-evaluation, including thematic reviews (paragraph 10 of the minute refers).
- 3.2 The Continuous Improvement Team (including Peer Reviewers) undertook the first of the planned thematic reviews into 'The Attainment and Achievements of Looked After Children' in February 2013.
- 3.3 The report on the outcomes of the review, including areas for improvement are contained in **APPENDIX 1.**
- 3.4 Following consultations within their respective sections the Heads of Integrated Children's Services and Schools and Curriculum Development

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have prepared an action plan to address the areas for improvement. This is contained in **APPENDIX 2.**
