1.1 INTRODUCTION

The main aims of the Moray Community Safety Partnership Strategy for 2005-2008 are as follows:

1. To reduce accidents in Moray
2. To reduce crime and fear of crime
3. To tackle antisocial behaviour
4. To tackle substance misuse

The aim of this report is to assess the performance of the Moray Community Safety Partnership in relation to these aims during the third quarter of the fiscal year 2007/2008.

Performance has been measured against several previously identified outcomes (4 under the heading Community Safety and 5 under the heading Antisocial Behaviour) using a range of performance indicators, (listed below), as specified in the Community Safety Action Plan 2007/2008 and the Antisocial Behaviour Outcome Agreement 2005 – 2008.

To determine the trend over time, data for 2006/2007 have been included where available.

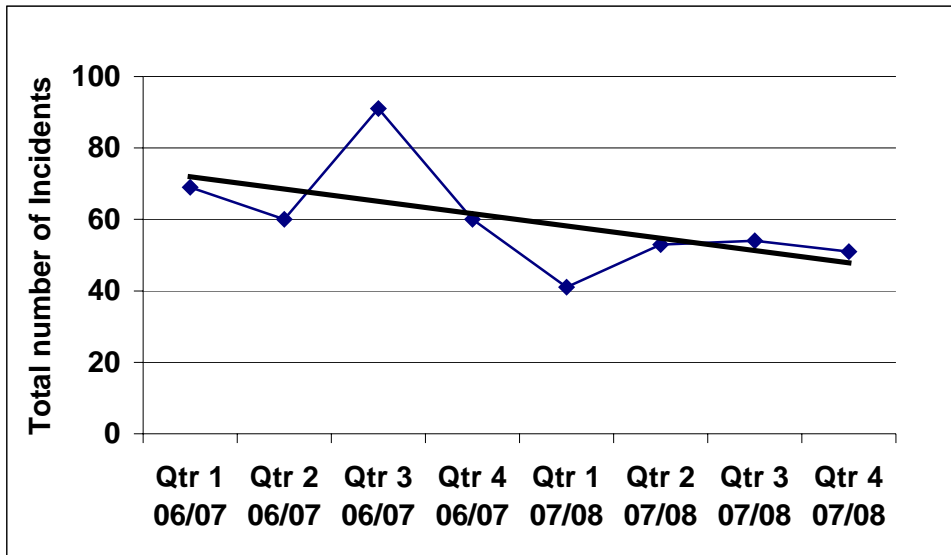
1) Reduce accidents in Moray

There are three PIs from the CSAP that are used to measure performance in this area. The table below shows the number of incidents recorded for each PI in each quarter over the last 2 years. The graph illustrates the total number of accidents recorded in each quarter over the same period.

The total number of accidents recorded for the Community Safety Partnership to measure progress in this area is 15%, 9 incidents, lower than in quarter 4 last year and 3 lower than last quarter. There is an overall downward trend over the last 2 years, reflecting a downward trend for all 3 measures.

In total in 2007/08, there were 81 fewer accidents recorded for the Community Safety Partnership than in 2006/07, a reduction of 29%.



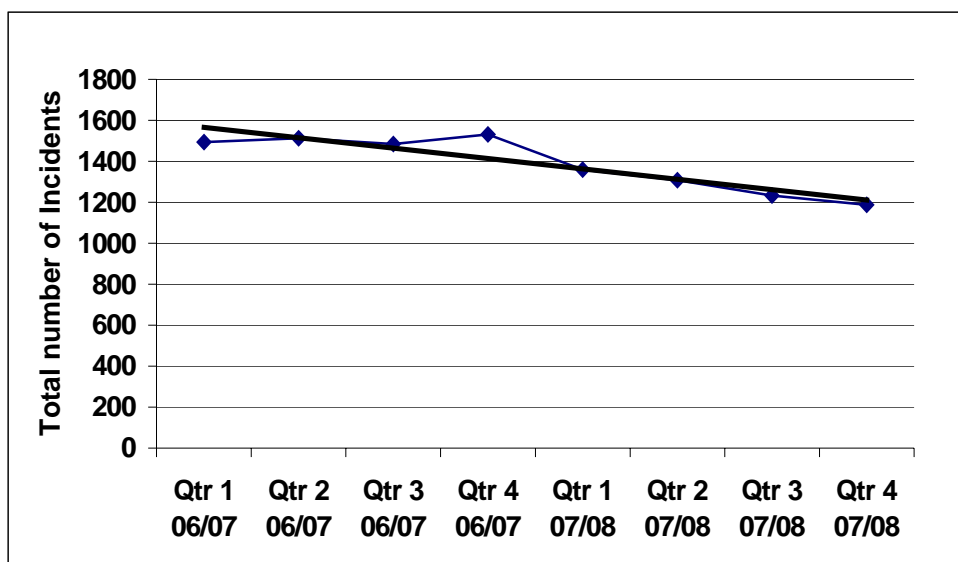
2) Reduce crime and the fear of crime

Progress is measured using a total of 12 PIs, 1 from the CSAP and 11 from the Antisocial Behaviour Outcome Agreement (ASBOA). The total number of crimes recorded for the Community Safety Partnership to measure progress in this area is 23% lower this quarter than in quarter 4 last year, and 4% lower than last quarter. There is an overall downward trend over the last 2 years, reflecting a downward trend in 9 of the 12 measures over the same period.

In total in 2007/08, there were 937 fewer crimes recorded for the Community Safety Partnership than in 2006/07, a drop of 16%.



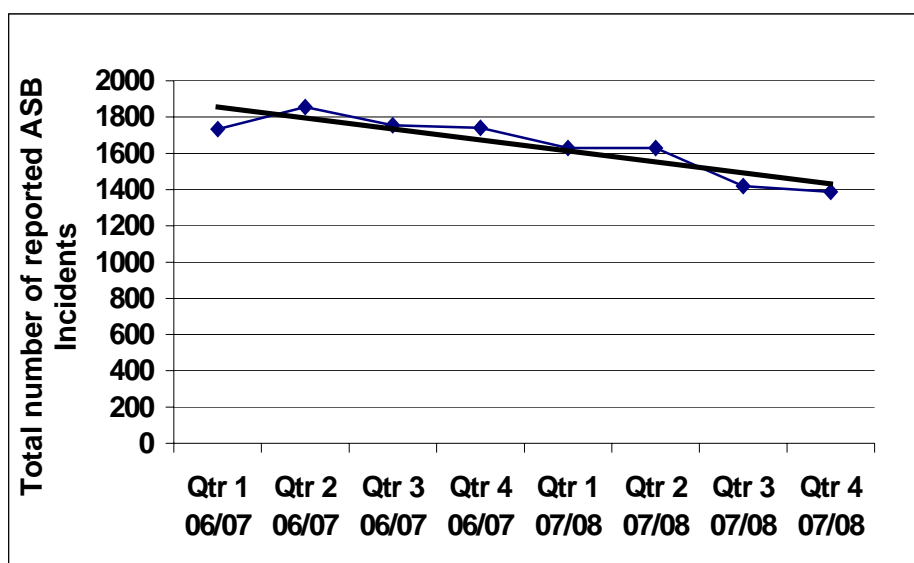
3) Tackle antisocial behaviour

The total number of incidents recorded for the Community Safety Partnership to measure antisocial behaviour is 20% lower this quarter than in quarter 4 last year, and has fallen by 2% from last quarter. There is an overall downward trend in the number of incidents recorded over the last 2 years, reflecting a downward trend in 11 of the 15 indicators over the same period.

In total in 2007/08, there were 1018 fewer incidents of antisocial behaviour recorded for the Community Safety Partnership than in 2006/07, a drop of 14%.

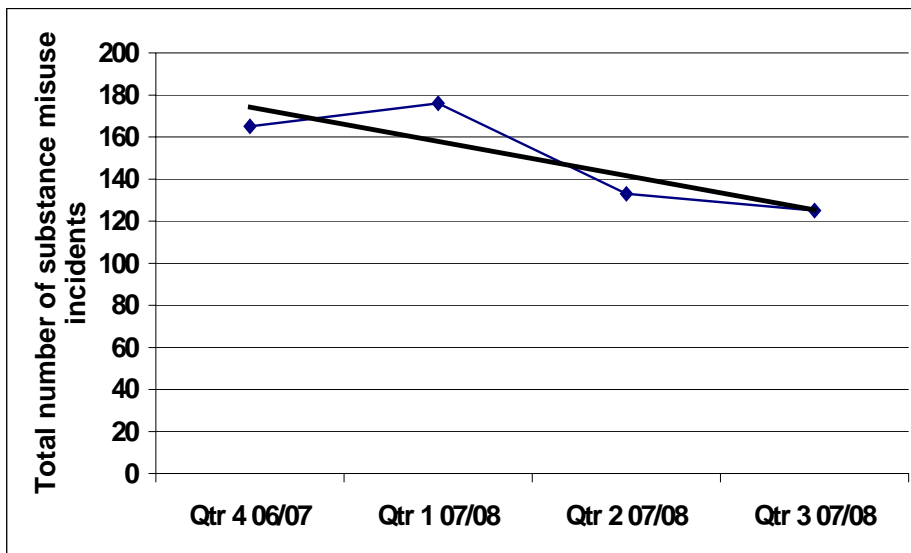


4) Tackle substance misuse

There are 4 PIs within the CSAP that are used to measure our progress in this area. However, it has not been possible to obtain data for one of these indicators and one has only been collected since quarter 4 06/07. The remaining 2 PIs, for which there is data since quarter 1 06/07, both show a downward trend.

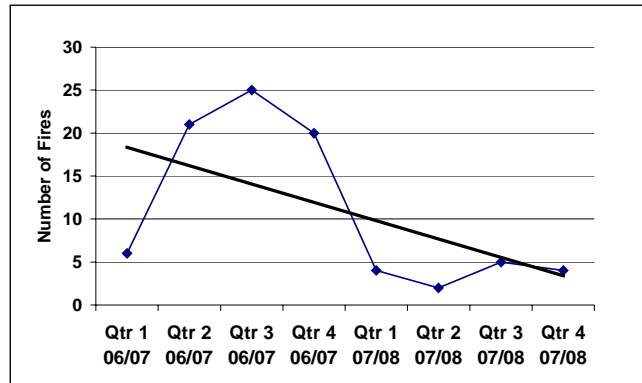

There were 4 accidental dwelling fires this quarter, where substance misuse was a factor. This is one less than last quarter and an 80% reduction on quarter 4 last year. There is a strong downward trend over the last 2 years.

In total, there were 15 accidental dwelling fires in 2007/08 where substance misuse was a factor, 79% lower than in 2006/07.



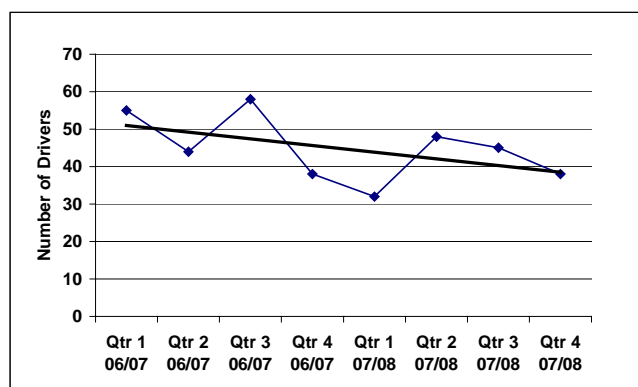

The number of offences recorded this quarter was the same as in quarter 4 last year and there were 7 fewer offences than last quarter. The graph illustrates the downward trend in the number of recorded drink-drive offences over the last 2 years.

There were 28 males and 6 females reported for drink-driving offences this quarter.



During 2007/08, a total of 150 drivers were reported for drink-driving offences, 125 males and 25 females. They ranged in age from 17 to 74 years, with 52 offenders in the category of young drivers aged 25yrs and under, and 5 drivers aged 65yrs and over. 9 drivers were repeat offenders.

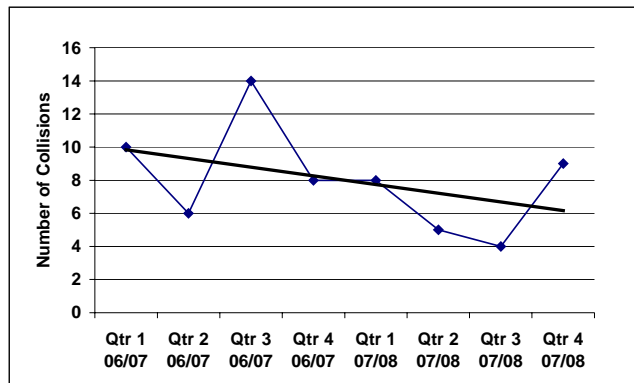
In total, there were 32 fewer offences recorded in 2007/08 than in 2006/07, a reduction of 16%.

In total, there were 12 fewer collisions in 2007/08 than in 2006/07, a fall of 32%.

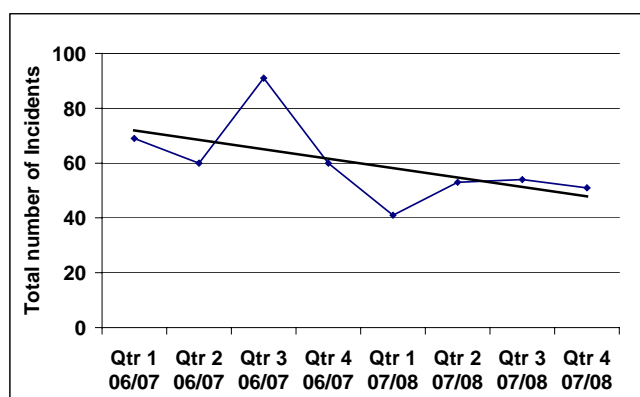
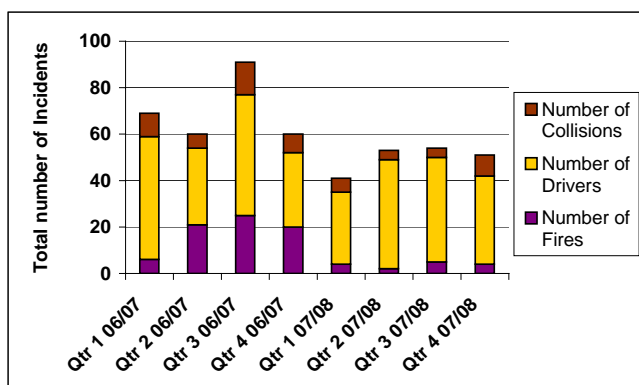

The total number of incidents recorded in quarter 4 is 9 lower than in quarter 4 last year, a reduction of 15%, and 3 lower than last quarter. The overall trend for this outcome over the last 2 years is downward.

In total in 2007/08, there were 81 fewer incidents recorded under this outcome than in 2006/07, a reduction of 29%.

In quarter 4 07/08 there were 591 young people reported or warned for offences in Moray, 1 more than last quarter. Of these, 267, 45%,

were recorded as being under the influence of alcohol or drugs. This is 4 more than last quarter, but represents the same proportion of all young people reported or warned.

Of the 267, 6 were under the influence of drugs, a similar proportion to last quarter, 101 were drunk, a smaller proportion than last quarter and 160 had been drinking, a larger proportion than quarter 3. A further 28% were recorded as sober while the sobriety of 27% was unknown, both the same as last quarter. One young person

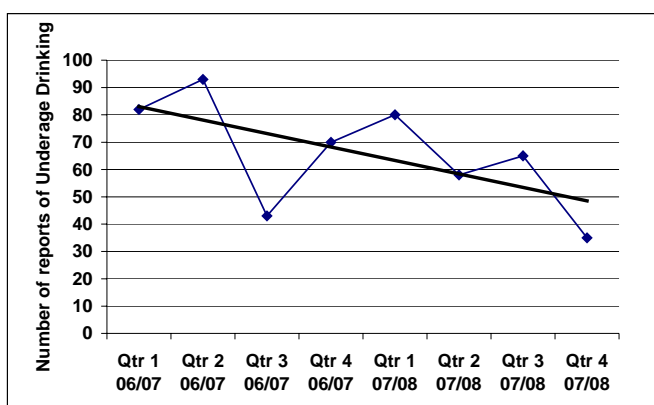
In total, 2389 young people were reported or warned for offences in Moray in 2007/08, 1069 of whom were recorded as having been under the influence of alcohol or drugs at the time of offending, 45% of the total. Of these, 3% had taken drugs, 38% were drunk and 59% had been drinking.

There were 35 reported incidents of underage drinking this quarter, compared with 70 in the 4th quarter last year, a fall of 50%. There were 30 fewer reports this quarter than last quarter.

There is a continuing downward trend in the number of reported incidents of underage drinking, as illustrated.



Of the 35 reports, 17 were found to be credible: 10 of 17 in Elgin Inspector area, 1 of 3 in Forres Inspector area, 4 of 7 in Buckie Inspector area and 2 of 8 in Lossiemouth Inspector area.

During quarter 4, 49 letters were sent to parents regarding their children's involvement in underage drinking. These covered a range of actions from possessing alcohol, being under the influence of alcohol, being in the company of others who fitted the aforementioned categories or being in the area where alcohol had been found secreted. 12 of these letters related to a child who had been found in such circumstances at least once before, resulting in a referral to Moray Drug & Alcohol Services.

In total in 2007/08, there were 50 fewer reported incidents of underage drinking than in 2006/07, a reduction of 17%. Of the 238 reported incidents this year, 154 were found to be credible, representing 65% of the total. However, the proportion of credible reports has reduced over the course of the year, from 74% in quarter 1 to 49% in quarter 4.

There are currently 77 people banned from licensed premises by Pubwatch members – 58 in Elgin, 5 in Forres, 8 in Buckie and 3 in each of Keith and Lossiemouth.

Of the 77, 5 were new bans this quarter, all in Elgin.

There has been a quarterly average of 72 people banned in Moray under the Pubwatch scheme.

drugs, a drop of 7 from last quarter. 8 were when under the influence of drugs, 122 when drunk and 139 when the young person had been drinking.

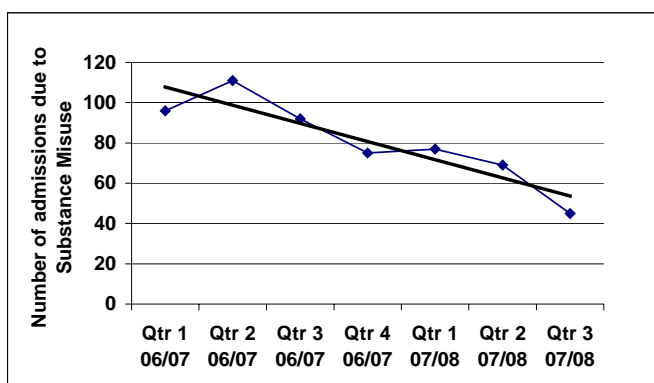

In quarter 3, there were 45 emergency admissions to hospital due to substance misuse, 29 due to drugs and 16 due to alcohol. This is a 51% drop from quarter 3 last year and a 35% drop from last quarter, continuing the downward trend in this measure.

Of those admitted due to drugs, around half were aged 35yrs or under, 2 of whom were under 18yrs. Of those admitted due to alcohol, 7 were aged 35yrs or under, 3 of whom were under 18yrs.

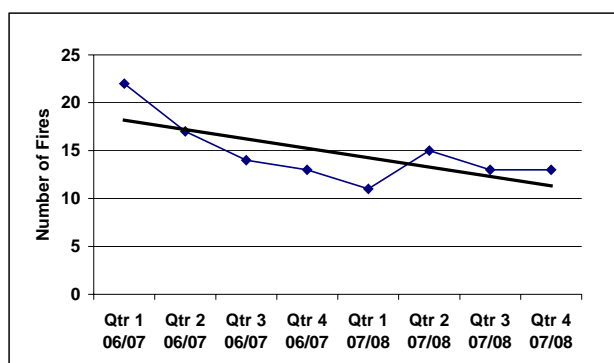

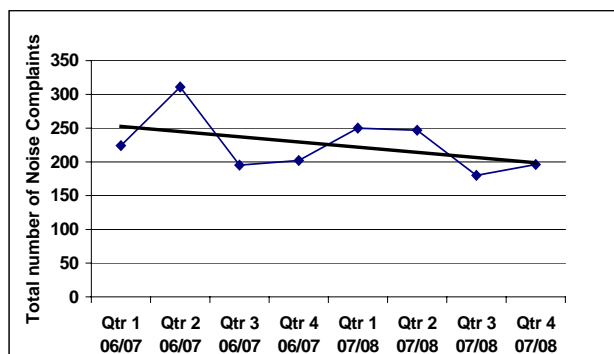

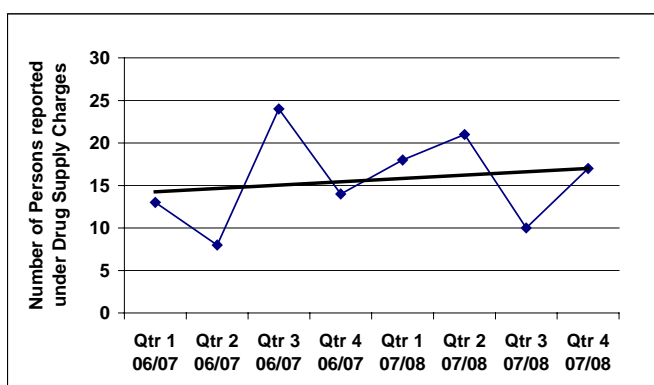

Alcohol was seized on several occasions, either found secreted or confiscated from youths.

There was a total of 42 Operations Avon in 2007/08, compared with 36 in 2006/07.

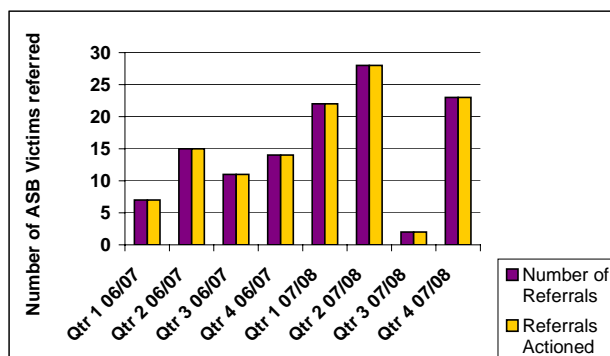

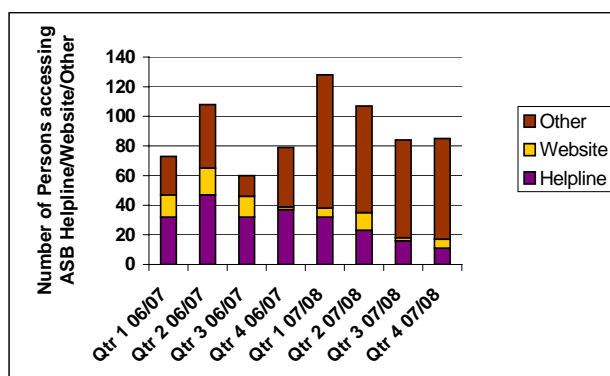

There were just 11 calls to the ASB Helpline this quarter, compared with 37 in quarter 4 last year, continuing a decline in the number of calls received. Six complaints were made through the website but as in every quarter this year, the main method of reporting complaints was to the ASB unit, either directly or via another agency or department. 80% of reports were made this way. The total number of complaints



received by the ASB unit was 85, an increase of 4 from quarter 4 last year, and 1 more than last quarter.

In total, there were 84 more complaints received in 2007/08 than 2006/07, a rise of 26%.

- Overall decrease this quarter of 22% in priority crimes compared with Quarter 4 of 2006/2007. The areas that have shown the biggest decrease are domestic housebreaking, down by 25 crimes, car crime, down by 64 recorded crimes and vandalism, down by 68 recorded offences.
- The current detection rate for Quarter 4 2007/2008 is 35%, which is 9% above that recorded in the same period last year.
- For the fiscal year 2007/2008 a total of 2,693 priority crimes recorded compared to 2,587 last year - a reduction of 4%.

- 3 Attempted Murders were recorded in the Division in the past quarter all of which were detected. For 2007/2008 11 attempted Murder Charges recorded compared with 6 for the previous year. The detection rate for Attempted Murder charges was 100%
- No murders were recorded in the Division in this fiscal year
- 9 Serious Assault charges recorded, which is a decrease of 1 on the same quarter last year. 40 Serious assault charges recorded this fiscal year compared with 36 last year. 98% detection rate for this crime this fiscal year.
- 4 Assault and Robbery charges recorded this quarter in the Division, one of which was detected. This is the same level as that recorded in Quarter 4 last year. - Quarter 4 2007/2008 has shown an increase of 3 recorded charges compared with the same quarter last year. Overall figures for the fiscal year show that there have been 66 recorded charges for drugs supply compared with 59 for 2006/2007.
- 17 drug supply charges recorded this quarter compared to 14 for the same quarter last year. 12% increase in drugs supply charges for the Division for the fiscal year compared to last year.
- This quarter the M3D beat recorded the highest proportion of drugs supply charges which was as a result of specific operations targeting the supply of Class A drugs.
- A total of 11 Drug Search warrants were executed in Moray Division in the past quarter of which 6 yielded a positive result where drugs were seized which is a success rate of 54%.
- There has been 2 drugs related deaths recorded in Moray Division this quarter which gives a total of five drug related deaths in Moray for the fiscal year 2007/2008. All were males aged 25, 31,33, 34 and 47 years of age and all were opiate related. This compares to 8 drug related deaths for 2006/2007.

- Quarter 4 2007/2008 has seen a 51% decrease in the car crime in the Division compared with the same quarter last year. The detection rate this quarter at 42.6% is the highest for any quarter since 01 April 2006. The level of car crime for the fiscal year 2007/2008 has seen 118 fewer recorded car crimes in Moray Division than 2006/2007.
- 26 of the 61 recorded crimes relate to theft or attempted theft of motor vehicles with a detection rate of 69.2%. Thefts of motor vehicles in Moray are down by 31% this year compared with the 2006/2007 figures.

- Vandalism offences have decreased by 68 recorded offences this quarter compared with the same period last year, with a 10.4% increase in the detection rate.
- For the fiscal year 2007/2008 there were 137 fewer recorded vandalism offences compared with last year, which equates to a 7.2% decrease in recorded vandalism in the Division.
- Buckie Inspector area shows a decrease of 27 offences this quarter compared to the same quarter 2006/2007. For the fiscal year vandalism offences in Buckie Inspector area were down by 8 recorded offences compared to last year. 28% detection rate for vandalism in this area compared to 24% last year.
- Elgin Inspector area shows a decrease of 33 recorded vandalism this quarter compared to the same period last year and for the fiscal year 2007/2008 is down by 45 crimes. The detection rate for 2007/2008 was 24% compared to 26% last year.
